### Double success - Orsett Primary School

ORSETT Primary School has double cause for celebration.

It has been ranked in the top 200 primary schools nationally for SATS results progress - and it has been judged as "outstanding" by a church schools organisation.

The Statutory Inspectors of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) is carried out on all church schools and mirrors the Ofsted inspectors.

Orsett, a Church of England school, was found to be outstanding in areas of Christian character, collective worship, religious education and its leadership at its latest inspection.

At its last Ofsted inspection in November 2012, the school was found to be "good", having been "satisfactory" two years earlier.

Headteacher Lizzie Goodby said: "Last time we had an Ofsted inspection under the new
