Dear Parents,

Welcome back-I hope you had a good break. Over the next six weeks' class 1 will be studying different subjects which will be linked with the theme 'Castles'.

In this way we believe that the children will gain a greater understanding of the world around us and why learning is important to us all if we are to become responsible and independent learners.

If children understand why they need to learn something and see its relevance to their own lives not only will they actively enjoy their learning but also they will achieve higher standards in their work than if they see no point in their learning.

Each theme is based around the specific National Curriculum (NC) Skills that are needed to be mastered by our children and during the next six weeks theme of *Castles*, we will be covering the NC Skills listed in *History, Geography and Science*. Below is an outline of what the children will be learning about:

<i>History</i>	<i>During this term, we will be learning about famous castles including Leeds castle. We will be learning about King Henry VIII and his six wives. Our visit to Leeds castle will provide your child with ample information to develop their historical understanding.</i>
<i>Geography</i>	<i>In geography, we will be using world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries. Devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key (castle, landmarks) When using our map, we will learn to use locational and directional language (e.g. near, far, left, right).</i>
<i>Science</i>	<i>In Science, we will continue learn about animals and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, including pets)</i>

Every child will experience a variety of different ways of learning including reading, writing, mathematics, problem solving, illustrating, working independently and working collaboratively and their progress towards the NC Skills will be continually assessed again in a variety of ways.

I know that as parents you are keen to support your child in their learning and would ask that you talk to your child about what they are learning during this theme – let them teach you!

I would be very grateful if you could spend some time researching with your child/ren and if anyone has relevant items or experience and knowledge please let me know as soon as possible, as the more information and support that your child has, the more successful their learning will be.

I would like to thank you all for your support with your children's learning - it really does make a difference. If anyone has any questions as to how to help your child, please do not hesitate to get in touch with me at the earliest opportunity.
