Daily practise		
Reading	Read for 15 mins, go over words they are unsure of. Practise phonemes chart before reading with your child.	
Writing	Each day could children practice writing their full name. Look at their letter formation. If the letter is not formed correctly encourage your child to practice that letter specifically. Remind them to use a capital letter, full stop and finger spaces. We always give time during the week for your child to read what they have written. Children to practice spellings on spelling shed.	
Mathematics	Practice writing numbers ensuring they are the right way round.
